
There are a number of coal seams running under Owlthorpe: Sitwell Thin Coal, Sitwell, Rawmarsh and Silkstone. History shows that coal in Owlthorpe has been mined by a number of pits including the Birley group of pits.

One thing that both mines have in common is that they are situated at the side of the Ochre Dyke; water had to be constantly pumped out of both when in operation.

It is believed that vast quantities of coal were extracted from the Dent Main colliery which was very successful and had a commercial contract to supply Blackburn Meadows power station in Sheffield. The colliery owned two 7 – ton Lorries, which took coal to the power station on a regular basis. The Colliery also supplied the steelworks in Sheffield, the main haulers being Robinsons of Sheffield. Local coal dealers, M. Heath Jones of Intake and Keeton & Richardson, were also used for nearby small businesses and household coal sales. The drift was driven at an incline of 1 in 3.3 into the Parkgate seam of coal, which is due east from this location.

Coal Mining is part of Owlthorpe Heritage. Moorhole Colliery is situated on Owlthorpe Heritage & Nature Trail. (Plot (F) is situated on Moor Valley opposite Diamond Cottages.)
